### **Bible Works – Wednesday, February 17**

Get a head start on your biblical exegesis paper! Learn about BibleWorks, a software program for biblical exegesis and research. Learn how to compare multiple English editions of the Bible, how to search for English and Greek/Hebrew words, and how to search for every instance of a Greek (or Hebrew) word in the Greek (Hebrew) Bible and display it in a digital presentation.
