We are delighted by your interest to take the next step in ministry in pursuit of your Doctor of Educational Ministry at Columbia Theological Seminary! It is our hope that you will join our community of theological inquiry, leadership development, and formation for ministry in the service of Jesus Christ. We believe that doctoral education for educational ministry leaders is a sacred calling to enhance your knowledge, skills, and leadership capacities for the communities that you are called to serve. This packet is designed to answer some of your pressing questions as you begin the application process.

The DEdMin program begins a new cohort every other year with a new cohort beginning this September. Our application can be found on our website, <a href="www.CTSnet.edu">www.CTSnet.edu</a> and our application eligibility includes all of the following:

- A baccalaureate degree from an accredited college or university
- A first professional degree in educational ministry (MRE, MACE, or MDiv with demonstrated coursework in educational ministry) from an Association of Theological Schools (ATS) accredited institution
- A cumulative grade point average of honors level (B average or higher)
- At least three years of full-time work in educational ministry, after completing your master's degree.

The usual timeframe for completion of the DEdMin degree is four years, beginning with the fall semester when the two-week introductory seminar is taken. The introductory seminar is the first course of the degree program and establishes the cohort, the group of students who will study together for the introductory seminar and four required courses which form the core of the degree's coursework. You will then work with your academic advisor to complete a curriculum design, plan a practicum to enhance the depth and range of ministry skills in supervised ministry, select three electives, and, finally, design and execute your final project research.

The Doctor of Educational Ministry program typically has a four-year timeline and is a professional degree, designed to accommodate the busy ministry leader and working adult. We provide on-site, hybrid and online courses so that you can decide how to pursue your DEdMin experience. In this packet, you will find the 4-year program timeline, schedule for the upcoming introductory seminar and the tuition and fee listing. # DMin and DEdMin Estimated Cost Breakdown

Using current rates, effective Summer 2020

TOTAL ESTIMATED PROGRAM COST (including all fees & tuition): \$16.356

#### **FEES INCLUDE**

- \$50 Application fee
- \$250 Entering Student fee
- \$640 Annual student fee (\$160/year for 4 years)
- \$35 Thesis binding fee for 1 copy
- \$200 Commencement fee

#### **COSTS OTHER THAN TUITION & FEES**

The other basic categories of expense aside from tuition are travel, housing, meals, and books. These expenses vary greatly depending on how far students travel; whether they can stay with friends, family, or colleagues; if/how they commute during courses at CTS; etc.

#### **HOUSING**

On-campus housing is available in the Harrington Center. The current rates are:

\$83.16/night single occupancy \$106.92/night double occupancy \$92.88/night queen (bed) room

#### **MEALS**

Students can cook for themselves in one of the two Harrington Center kitchens OR eat in the campus refectory, where meals are approximately:

\$7.56 for breakfast

\$9.29 for lunch

\$10.37 for dinner

#### **BOOKS**

The estimated cost of books per course is \$100, but the actual amount varies widely.
