

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

#### **CLL Online Courses**

Since 2014, the CLL has offered over 100 online courses. Program topics have included age and stage Christian education and teaching practice and theory, intercultural competency, grief, death and dying, stewardship, congregational ministry, church staff relations, conflict resolution, coaching, prayer, spiritual formation, spiritual direction, journaling, storytelling, LGBTQIA+ issues, older adult ministry, preaching, biblical studies, arts, science, and faith.

## SPIRITUALITY PROGRAMS

The Center for Lifelong Learning's spirituality programs are grounded in Christian spirituality, Scripture, theology, a history of traditions, reading in the spiritual classics, prayer and meditation, and developing skills for assisting others on a spiritual journey.

Choose from two certificates: The Certificate in Spiritual Formation and the Certificate in Spiritual Direction. The spiritual formation courses are designed to help individuals deepen their relationship with God. Those who take formation courses gain skills to respond to spiritual hunger in various contexts. #### What is Spirituality?

"Spirituality is the process of awakening to the truth that we are one with God, and that God is present within us," said Associate Director of Spirituality Programs, Sharon Junn. Meister Eckhart speaks to this unity when he says, "the eye through which I see is the same eye through which God sees me; my eye and God's eye are

one eye, one seeing, one knowing, one love."

"Cultivating contemplative capacities and the divine faculties within us, helps make us aware of God's mysterious presence and action within. While intellectual understanding can be helpful, what frees us to consent to God's action is *experiencing* God.
Such experiences deeply nourish

our soul, mind, and spirit. It is liberating! Our programs emphasize contemplative orientation and highly experiential, praxis-driven modules designed to support the participant's growth and trust in the work of the Spirit. The programs are a formation process to access the flow of God's giving, allowing us to rest and let God work through us," said Junn.

In this course you'll experience your daily life as prayer and gain contemplative attitudes and dispositions as you deepen your contemplative spiritual practices within a community of seekers. As you learn to cultivate contemplative practices amid ordinary life, you'll begin to experience oneness with God and all creation

#### PASTORAL EXCELLENCE PROGRAMS

Build on best practices for your professional and personal development as a ministry leader. *The Pastoral Excellence Programs* of the Center for Lifelong Learning include *three* professional development areas for clergy: *The Wounded Ministers Retreat*, *Leadership in Ministry (LIM) Workshops*, and the Thriving Congregations Grant program, *reKindle*.

LIM Workshops are offered at three locations across the country and as an online cohort. You'll explore with peers how Bowen Family Systems

- 4. Neglect a theology of calling.
- 5. Do not plan corporate worship together.
- 6. Maintain a dysfunctional personnel committee.
- 7. Make staff members responsible for other people's functioning.
- 8. Lower your expectations and your standards.
- 9. Neglect your own spiritual and personal growth.
- 10. Do not invest in your staff's professional development.
